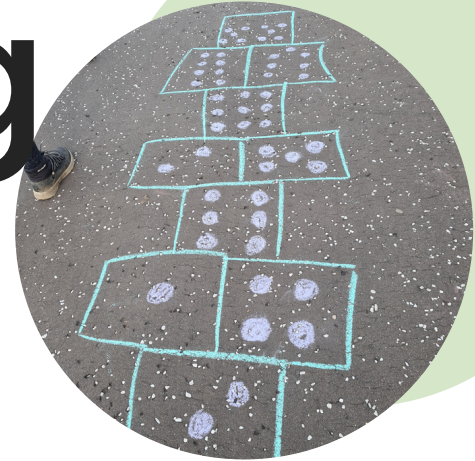


# Building Your Kit



## HANDY Kit

- Wool/ yarn – great for arts and crafts, measuring, marking off areas and more
- Chalk – take your writing, letter formation, art, maths or more outdoors
- Register – if your school policy allows, grab a photograph of it each time you head out. If it does not, then why not use matte laminating sheets so you can reuse it all year? Matte sheets allow you to write on it with pencil then rub it off!
- Medications – I often kept these in the front pocket, so children knew where to find them or give children responsibility of their own meds.
- Phone – it lets you contact the school and them contact you (make sure the phone have your number as well)
- Camera – great for gathering evidence
- Measuring tape (10m and ikea/ sewing little ones)- handy for maths and more
- Mini first aid kit – you never know when you will need it
- Small ball – turn-taking or games
- Electronic whistle - great for pulling kids back together and means you do not need to worry about anyone else using it (or use an animal call etc if you are comfortable)
- Hand gel - always handy
